Revelation Chapters 8-9

The Trumpet Judgments (Chapter 8)

- **1st Trumpet:** hail and fire mingled with blood, and they were cast upon the earth:
- **2nd Trumper:** a great mountain burning with fire was cast into the sea:
- **3rd Trumpet:** a great burning star (Wormwood) from heaven fell upon the third part of the rivers, and upon the fountains of waters;
- **4th Trumpet:** the third part of the sun was smitten, and the third part of the moon, and the third part of the stars;. so as the third part of them was darkened,
- the third part of trees was burnt up, and all green grass was burnt up.
- the third part of the sea became blood; the third part of the living creatures in the sea died; and the third part of the ships were destroyed.
- the third part of the waters became wormwood; and many men died of the waters because they were made bitter.
- and the day shone not for a third part of it, and the night likewise

The First Woe (Revelation 9:1-12)

- **5th Trumpet**: a star fell from heaven unto the earth: he was given the key of the bottomless pit. he opened the bottomless pit; and there arose a smoke out of the pit, as the smoke of a great furnace; there came out of the smoke locusts upon the earth: and unto them was given power, as the scorpions of the earth have power. the shapes of the locusts were like unto horses prepared unto battle; and on their heads were as it were crowns like gold, and their faces were as the faces of men. they had hair as the hair of women, and their teeth were as the teeth of lions. they had breastplates, as it were breastplates of iron; and the sound of their wings was as the sound of chariots of many horses running to battle. And they had a king over them, which is the angel of the bottomless pit, whose name in the Hebrew tongue is Abaddon, but in the Greek tongue hath his name Apollyon.
- and the sun and the air were darkened by reason of the smoke of the pit.
- it was commanded them (locusts) that they should not hurt the grass of the earth, neither any green thing, neither any tree; but only those men which have not the seal of God on their foreheads.
- And to them it was given that they should not kill them, but that they should be tormented five months: and their torment was as the torment of a scorpion when he striketh a man. in those days shall men seek death, and shall not find it; and shall desire to die, and death shall flee from them.
- And they had tails like unto scorpions, and there were stings in their tails: and their power was to hurt men five months.

The Second Woe (Revelation 9:13-21)

- **6th Trumpet:** a voice from the four horns of the golden altar which is before God, saying to the sixth angel which had the trumpet, Loose the four angels which are bound in the great river Euphrates. The four angels were loosed, which were prepared for an hour, and a day, and a month, and a year,
- And the number of the army of the horsemen were two hundred thousand thousand: and I heard the number of them. And thus I saw the horses in the vision, and them that sat on them, having breastplates of fire, and of jacinth, and brimstone: and the heads of the horses were as the heads of lions;
- For their power is in their mouth, and in their tails: for their tails were like unto serpents, and had heads, and with them they do hurt.
- for to slay the third part of men.
- and out of their mouths issued fire and smoke and brimstone. By these three was the third part of men killed, by the fire, and by the smoke, and byAnd the rest of the men which were not killed by these plagues yet repented not of the works of their hands, that they should not worship devils, and idols of gold, and silver, and brass, and stone, and of wood: which neither can see, nor hear, nor walk: Rev 9:21 Neither repented they of their murders, nor of their sorceries, nor of their fornication, nor of their thefts. the brimstone, which issued out of their mouths.

Chronological vs. Parenthetical

- Chronological – In these sections, the events happen one after the other in sequential order. These sections unfold in a straightforward manner. The basic truths in the chronological sections are not difficult to understand. The passages say just what they mean.
- Parenthetical – A parenthetical section is a section that is meant to qualify or explain the previous chronological section. The purpose/s of the parenthetical sections are to explain the chronological sections. They are the interpretative sections that answer the questions that come up in the chronological sections.
